Author **Johanna Jackson's** novel writing has been spurred on by Spirit

A few weeks after her beloved nan died, Johanna discovered a strong connection with the spirit world, inspiring her to write three books.

In a vivid dream, Jo floated up to her nan, who was standing on a balcony in a hall, smiling and saying how happy she was to see her granddaughter again.

When her nan said, 'I have to go,' and then faded away, on the ground where she had been standing were four sixpences.

It was an odd dream but, when Jo shared it with her mum, it turned out to make total sense.

Apparently, Jo's nan used to have a moneybox full of old sixpences, which she planned

to give her grandchildren when she died. Unfortunately, after her death, Jo's uncle had banked the sixpences, not knowing Nan's wishes.

After that, Jo felt her nan's spirit close to her all the time, including when she was writing her first book, *Love Twists as Life Turns*, which she self-published in 2016.

Finding the story

'I had a rough idea of what the story was about – a group of friends – but certainly didn't have a beginning, middle and end. But as I was typing, I felt like the story was dripping from my fingertips, like I was being inspired from a different realm.'

The book has a spiritual aspect involving a character who is collected by a relative in Spirit when it's time for her to leave the earthly realm.

Jo says her second book, *Kellie's Dreams*, which was published a year later, is also a story that was gifted to her from Spirit.

'A friend of mine had said to me weeks before that there

'Suddenly, I started to be given, as an idea in my head, the bones of the story I was going to write,' she continues.

'My spirit guide was in the story, as if he had been with me in a past life. So was my current husband, who had shared a past incarnation with me. I just knew that my guide, Ibrahim, and Spirit were giving me this story.'

Jo's latest book *Promises, Secrets, Danger* is out now (£6.99, Amazon). She describes it as romantic fiction with a twist of spirituality.




